WORSHIP MINISTRY

SUNDAY WORSHIP SERVICES

- The Traditional worship service begins at 9:00 a.m. with traditional hymns by a pianist or recordings, inspiring sermons from the pulpit, ministry of music, prayers and scripture lessons.
- Church school classes begin at 10:15 a.m. for ages Nursery through Adult. Classes help the members grow in their relationship with Christ and one another through study and fellowship.
- The Contemporary worship service begins at 11:15 a.m. with AV praise music followed by dramas, videos, prayer, teaching, preaching and fellowship using less formal approaches in worship.

MINISTRY OF MUSIC

- Music plays an important part of worship in the Elgin congregation. We have truly talented musicians who use their talents to provide praise and worship music to help bring us closer to God. Our pianist may support the worship by playing while we gather in the sanctuary and for meditation. When available, they also accompany the hymns as we joyfully praise the Lord in song. We often have instrumental music as well as volunteer soloists, both young and young at heart. The Contemporary worship service uses more recorded music from CD's or DVD's to praise, worship, or show commitment to God. Our audio/visual teams add to our services with recorded songs and video presentations.
- Training on the Audio Visual equipment, led by David Lai, was held in late May for all people involved with AV. Presiders and anyone interested in helping with this important ministry were encouraged to attend.

SUNDAY SCHOOL PROGRAM

- Our Sunday school program begins in September and runs through May. In preparation for the start of a new year, we all gathered on September 13 at 10:10 a.m. in the sanctuary. Mark McClellan and Nancy McClellan presented a puppet show encouraging attendance in Sunday school. Ralph Wineman, Christian Education Director, presented Gracie Kent with a certificate of promotion to the Jr. High Class. A class picture was taken by Linda Meyer and a prayer of blessing was given by Bill Hedrich.
- Sunday school classes this year were organized as:
 - Nursery-Preschool Class is available on a weekly basis as needed but has no children on the class roll.
 - Primary-Junior Class (Kindergarten thru 5th grade) Teacher Linda Meyer
 - Junior High Class (6th thru 8th grade) Teachers Sheryl Sawyers and Mark McClellan
 - Senior High Class (9th thru 12th grade) Teacher Nancy McClellan

- Adult Class Teacher Bill Howard
- The Primary-Junior class studied Jack and Jenn and the "Not So Secret Mission", an introduction to the Mission Initiatives for Children. They also made their own film strip covering the five initiatives and worked on thankfulness and preparing the way for Jesus.
- The Junior High Class is using Seasons of the Spirit with themes and lessons which line up with the focus of the Sunday worship services.
- The Senior High Class uses the Temple School material in their studies.
- The Adult Class focused on the concept of the Kingdom of God as conveyed in our study of the life of Jesus. Special emphasis was placed on the Sermon on the Mount and how Jesus placed emphasis on how God's will is to be done on earth as it is in heaven.

KID'S KAMP

• During the summer, Kid's Kamp was offered twice a month during the 10:00 a.m. worship service. The theme was: "Putting on the Full Armor of God". Linda Meyer organized this class for children ages 5-15. A fun-filled Kid's Kamp Carnival was held on August 23rd. See information about this in Youth Ministry.

CONTEMPORARY WORSHIP

- The Contemporary worship ministries focus on prayer and intimacy with God and others in our church family.
- We allow ourselves to go where the spirit leads us; whether it be a personal need for prayer or perhaps sharing a testimony.
- We are using the Community of Christ lectionary-based worship resources and themes to guide our worship services, but presiders are encouraged to choose whatever elements they feel will be most beneficial in meeting the spiritual needs of the congregation.
- People of all ages are involved in leading praise, praying, reading scripture, drama, ministry of music, planning and presiding over worship and even preaching!

TRADITIONAL WORSHIP

- The Traditional worship service has again done an excellent job bringing in guest speakers to provide a diversity of ideas in worship and fellowship with the congregation. Priesthood, members, and friends have freely accepted and served, providing exceptional spirit filled services.
- The Traditional worship service uses the Bible, Book of Mormon, and Doctrine & Covenants, as authorized by The Community of Christ Church, along with testimonies of how Jesus Christ, our Savior, has influenced our lives.
- The Traditional worship service encourages each of us to reach out to the community where we live, work, and play to share our testimonies and our love for each other. With a willingness to serve our Heavenly Father, each member

and friend(s) attending has felt the Holy Spirit encouraging them to study and witness with everyone they come in contact.

 The Visiting Vase - In an effort to be invitational, our Missionary Coordinator, Cloyd Dowell, introduced "The Inviting Vase". Each Sunday, before we begin our worship, anyone who has invited someone to church (even if they did not attend) comes forward to place a stone into a glass vase for each person invited. If you invited three people to come to church, you would place three blue stones in the vase. If you enabled someone to attend church, you would place a maroon stone in the vase for each person you enabled to attend church. Enabling would mean if you drove them to church or paid transportation expenses for them to attend.

LEADING CONGREGATIONS IN MISSION

• The bi-monthly pastor's meeting was combined with the Leading Congregations in Mission meetings. Lisa Ackley, Co-Pastor Mark McClellan, Nancy McClellan, Bill Howard and John Kent represent the Elgin congregation for LCM. The LCM program is designed to help any size congregation discern, experiment, and engage in missional ministries oriented around the unique giftedness of its people. The meetings include worship, reports from Associate pastors, ongoing ministries, concerns, upcoming events (Kid's Kamp, Sunday school classes, Easter and Christmas planning) worship schedules, Young Peacemaker's Club, etc.

ELGIN RETREAT

 From January 23 thru January 25, we were blessed to have Apostolic Assistant Michele McGrath lead our congregation in a retreat using the theme: "Receive It: A Journey of Trust". Our weekend began with a "Meet and Eat" gathering by sharing in a Chinese Hot Pot meal supervised by Lisa Ackley. Kevin Henrickson led us in song throughout the weekend. The retreat involved missional practices of dwelling in the word, prayer, and hearing Michele's personal testimonies where Christ has led her in new directions. We were challenged to seek God's spirit by using the Mission Prayer: "God, where will your Spirit lead today? Help me be fully awake and ready to respond. Grant me courage to risk something new and become a blessing of your love and peace. Amen".

SHARE AND PRAYER

• A new ministry "Share and Prayer", where we share our concerns, joys and prayers for one another, was hosted and led by Jayne Ackley each Wednesday evening during the summer months. Some of the themes used for this worship were "Seeing thru God's Eyes" and "Broken to Serve". With a desire to continue this ministry, Bill and Jean Hedrich hosted and led a meeting in September and Kevin and Michelle Henrickson hosted and led in October.

FELLOWSHIP MINISTRY

WOMEN'S FELLOWSHIP

- The purpose of this group is to discover and magnify the divine purpose of each woman through study, fellowship and service. We study scriptures from the Bible but also, we share with our Christian sisters praise reports, prayer requests and the many concerns of our lives. We pray together, laugh together, and sometimes cry together. We share the love of Jesus Christ. Membership is made up of all the women in the Elgin congregation. The Women's Leader is Nancy Naber. Linda Meyer is Secretary and the Treasurer is Barbara Wertz. The Women's Fellowship meets in a member's home on the second Thursday of each month from March through December at 7:15 p.m. The meetings consist of devotion, prayer, study, church business, refreshments and fellowship. The women share by teaching the lesson month to month.
- Our study this year was the book, *Navigate,* by Norman Vincent Peale. It examines how the Bible can help us in every aspect of our lives including how to keep growing in our faith, how to trust in God and be at peace with ourselves and others and how to rest and recharge our spiritual batteries.
- In January Sylvia Elrod organized a fundraiser through Rada Cutlery. Our profit from this very successful project was \$252.00.
- Our Women's Fellowship purchased Easter lilies which were used to decorate the church for the Easter season. We were also in charge of the special Easter breakfast. Many members and visitors enjoyed a delicious meal.
- We hosted a Tea Party and Bridal Shower for two couples from our congregation. Will King and Katie McClellan and Olivia Finger and Jacob McClellan were honored at this April 11th event. Our hostesses were Linda Meyer and Lisa Ackley. Twenty-five people supported these two couples with gifts as they plan their lives together.
- The annual summer meal out was held at Biaggios Restaurant in Algonquin on June 12th.
- Per the suggestion of our Women's Fellowship leader, Nancy Naber, we decided to clean out and organize the church storage room which had become cluttered with many items we no longer use. On September 22nd, seven women gathered in the morning, took a lunch break and then returned in the afternoon to finish the job. Almost \$90.00 was spent compliments of our Women's Fellowship treasury to purchase plastic bins for better organization. The storage room looks amazing and is able to serve the needs of the church better.
- A collection is taken at each monthly meeting so we are able to fund activities and to buy needed items. We were very happy to donate \$100.00 each to two single moms from the Community of Christ On Edge group who were experiencing financial challenges. Our Treasurer, Barbara Wertz, reported that we have \$1,793.47 in our account.

• A special Christmas meeting was held in Jean Hedrich's home in December. The women enjoyed a delicious meal as well as worship given by Linda Meyer. Everyone was invited to bring a \$20.00 grab-bag gift.

SPECIAL FELLOWSHIP ACTIVITIES

- The Elgin Saints have a rich tradition of fellowship activities. One of the ways to honor this tradition is by enjoying a meal or dessert following worship services or other celebrations. While many individuals in our congregation help with these activities, Co-Pastor Jean Hedrich was instrumental in organizing many of the meals.
 - Each Sunday, treats are served in the adult Sunday school class. Sylvia Elrod is responsible for scheduling individuals to bring a treat to share.

Community families were invited and over 2000 came to receive food, clothing, personal prayer, professional services, medical and dental attention, legal counsel, biblical materials and the Gospel message. It was an all-out-effort, an all-hands-on-deck affair to give help and hope to those who most need it. This spring and fall, our Young Peacemaker's Club had a table. We have picked up many new YPC members from this event and feel it is a worthwhile activity in which to participate.

FEED MY STARVING CHILDREN

 This non-profit Christian organization is committed to feeding God's children hungry in body and spirit. Kate Kent organized members to meet in Libertyville on October 17th to hand-pack meals specifically formulated for malnourished children. These meals were shipped to FMSC distribution partners. FMSC meals have reached nearly 70 countries around the world.

PASTORAL CARE

• When our members are ill and hospitalized, they are visited by our priesthood and a get-well card and flowers are brought to them to brighten their day and to remind them that our healing prayers are being offered. Limited home visiting is part of this ministry also.

LEADERSHIP AND MEMBERSHIP DIRECTORY

• Co-Pastor Jean Hedrich is responsible for updating the Elgin Congregation Directory which is made available to all members and friends who attend our congregation on a regular basis.

HELPING OUR COMMUNITY

- During March Linda Meyer organized and collected various toys and candy suitable for Easter baskets. Our Sunday school classes helped fill the baskets on Palm Sunday. The 15 baskets were delivered to the Elgin Crisis Center after church on Palm Sunday.
- Linda Meyer organized a collection of school supplies during the summer months. A generous collection of pens, pencils, crayons, paper, folders and other supplies were donated to the Crisis Center just in time for school to start.
- Our congregation gave generously to the two food drives organized by Linda Meyer. The All Peoples Interfaith Food Panty were given donations in the spring and again in the fall.
- A very successful toy drive was held in December by Linda Meyer for the Elgin Crisis Center in which we received generous donations from our congregation. Linda Meyer took the toys to the center along with a \$50.00 cash donation for them to buy anything else that might be needed for the children.

OUTREACH INTERNATIONAL

• Our congregation contributes to Outreach International to support sustainable goods for children and their families living in poverty. Barbara and Jim Wertz organized this collection. Our congregation sent \$1008.42 to Haiti Schools and Nutrition raising money for the needy in Haiti.

COLLECTIONS FROM THE HEART

CAMP QUARRYLEDGE SUPPORT

- A special collection to support Camp Quarryledge is taken each month that has a 5th Sunday in it. Our CFO reported that \$1991.40 was collected in March, May, August and November and in personal envelopes throughout the year.
- Camp Quarryledge is showing her age so the Mission Center held three work days to complete various necessary projects ranging from outside yard work, replacing the playground surface, taking down and rebuilding the pump house, to sorting and cleaning inside. YOUTH MINISTRY

KID'S KAMP AND CARNIVAL

- Under the leadership of Linda Meyer, this ministry for children was offered during the 10:00 a.m. worship service beginning June 7th. Classes were held twice a month during the months of June, July and August. The theme, "Putting on the Full Armor of God" included lessons about why all six pieces of the armor are important and how it is crucial for successful lives. OFFICERS

- The CFO for Elgin congregation is an appointed position within the Chicago Mission Center. Once appointed, the CFO then receives a sustaining vote by the congregation. John Kent serves in this position for our congregation. His responsibilities include contribution processing, oblation requests, creating financial reports, and reporting to auditors. Additional duties may include managing the branch finances/checkbook/paying bills, creating budgets, negotiating and signing contracts, hiring people, building committee, and fund raising projects. He works closely with both the pastor and the Mission Center CFO to achieve the financial goals of the congregation.
 - 4/12- A congregational business meeting was held to discuss and approve the establishment of an Affiliate Investment Pool fund. This pool is combined with the World Church's endowment and reserve funds to create a portfolio that is professionally managed under the direction of the Presiding Bishopric with assistance from the World Church Investment Committee. Our initial deposit was \$1,000.00 but at the 10/25 business meeting to approve the 2016 budget, an additional \$4,000.00 was approved for deposit.

- Lisa Jauch and Sheryl Sawyers are the Elgin congregation Auditors. The general purpose of the audit is to validate the correctness of the Chief Financial Officer. They validate the contributions reported on the tax forms to the deposit made to the bank. In addition, they look at all large dollar expenses to check for back-up indicating the proper amount was paid for product or for work performed for the church. They also check several smaller payables to confirm they were recorded against the proper line item in the budget. Once they have been satisfied the profit and loss statement and the bank statements are correct, then they issue a brief report to World Church indicating the work they performed and our statement that the Elgin Congregation's books are in order.
- Serving as both Librarian and Secretary was Lisa Jauch. The position of Secretary requires Lisa to take accurate minutes at each congregational business meeting. These minutes are read and approved at the following meeting. As Librarian, she takes the time to periodically organize the books if they are misfiled. She also purchases new books that would be beneficial to the congregation.

- Co-Pastor Jean Hedrich serves as the Recorder and is responsible for the accurate reporting of congregational statistics such as births, ordinations, withdrawals, blessings, deaths, and transfers in and out.
- The Historian is Janet Bollow who tells the story of persons, events and developments in the life of the congregation and submits the congregational history to the World Church.
